

# About the Day

All of us, at some stage in our lives will be care-givers.

For some, the care offered will be professionally recognised and regulated as a nurse, a licensed lay minister, a priest or a charity worker. While, for others, the care offered will be less public and more personal because it involves looking after family or friends. Whoever we care for, we will care in a particular way, because of the people we care for, the context we are in and the people we are, with the training, skills, experience, attitudes and personality we have.

The day will hope to explore your own approach to care giving in the light of three classical images of care: the Shepherd, the Wounded Healer and the Wise Fool and some contemporary images of care such as the Midwife, the Indigenous Storyteller and the Gardener.

To help us in our discussions we will explore what theologians and spiritual writers have said about these images alongside interpretations of care found in the visual arts.

The day will involve time for individual reflection as well as opportunity to discuss with others.
